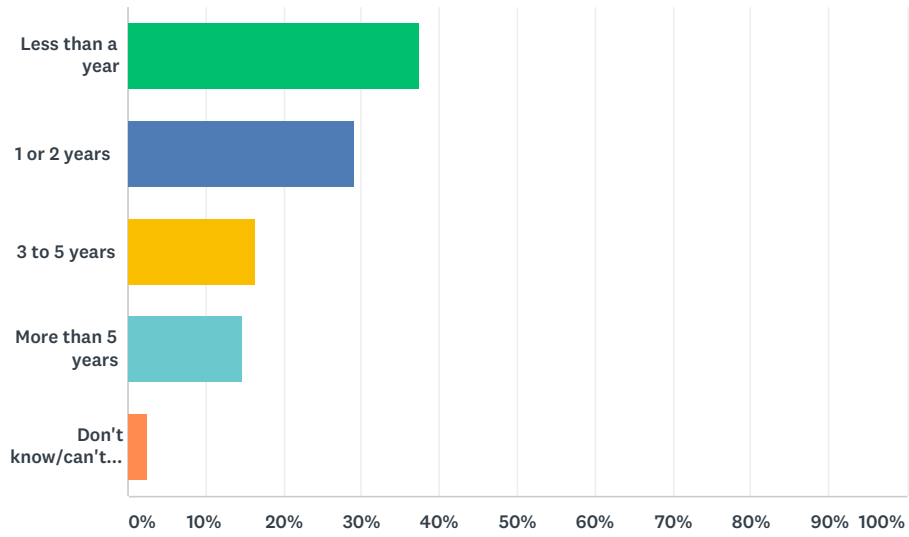


Q1 How long have you been a Domestic Abuse Champion?

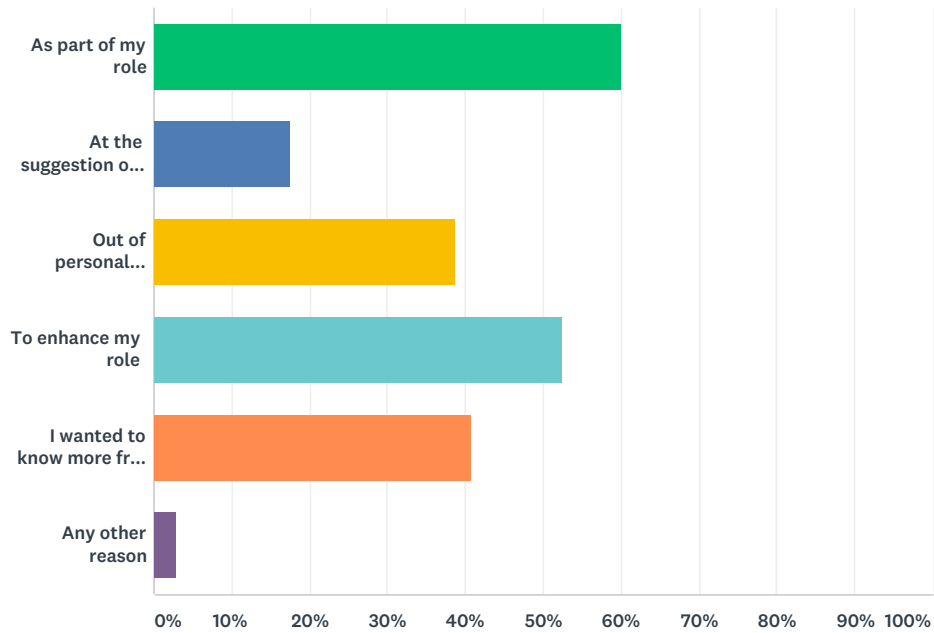

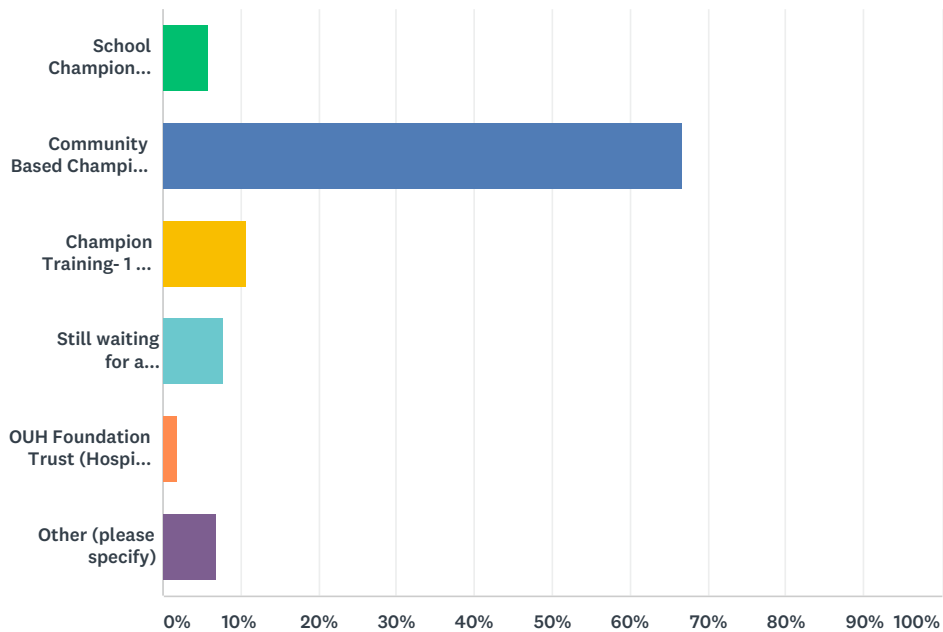

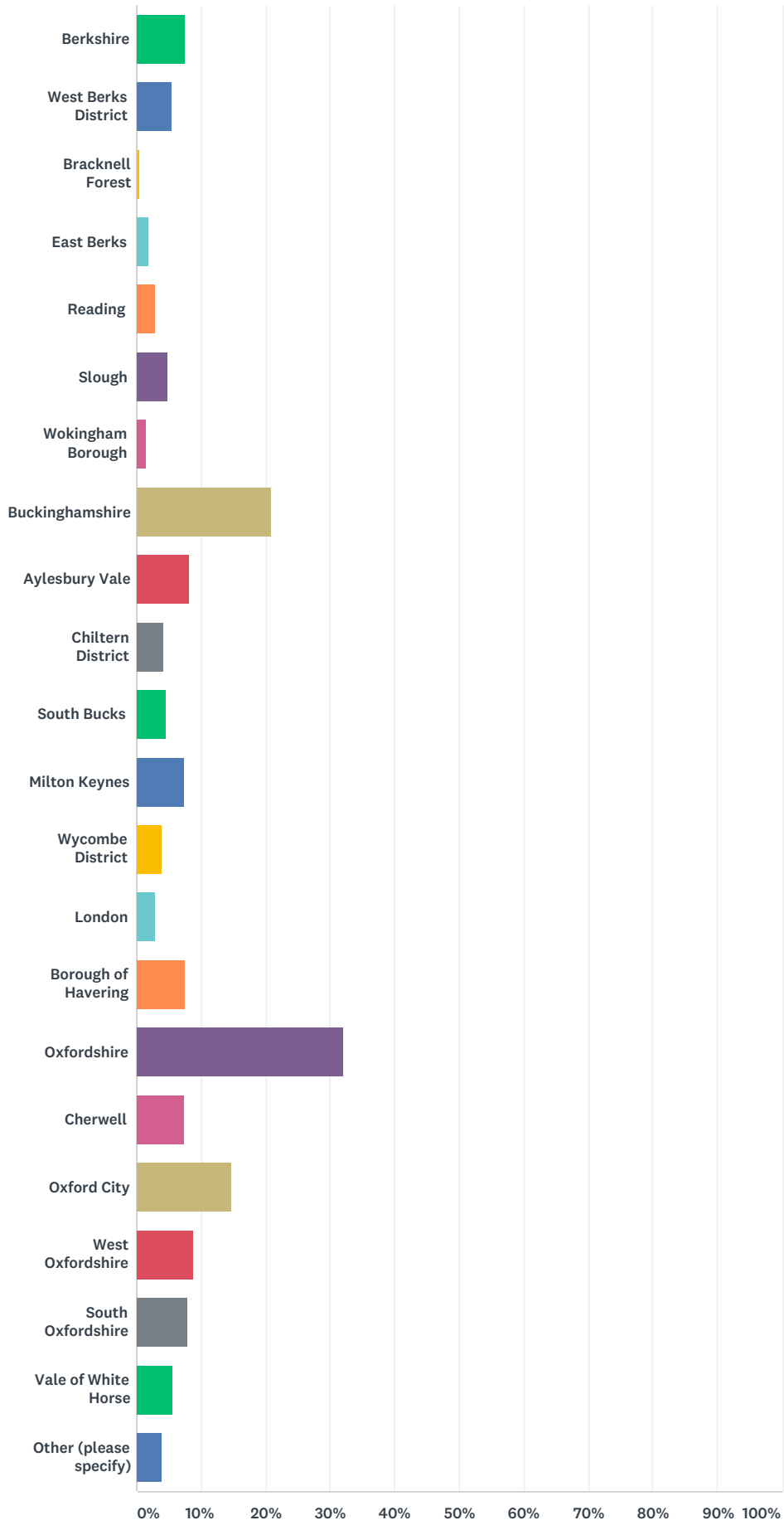

Q6 Have you changed your main role or job, since becoming a DA Champion?

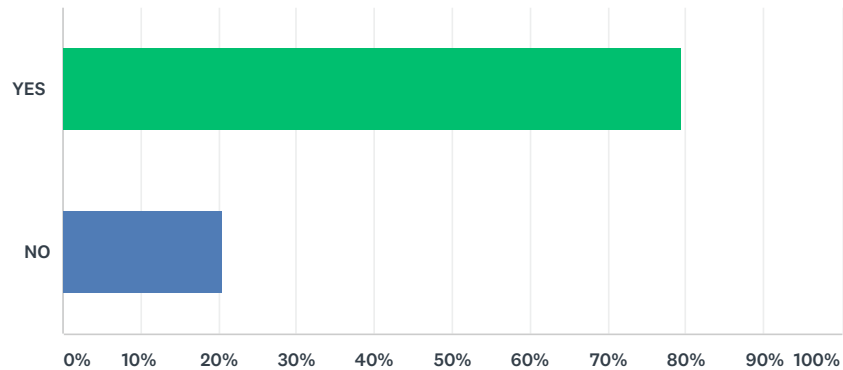

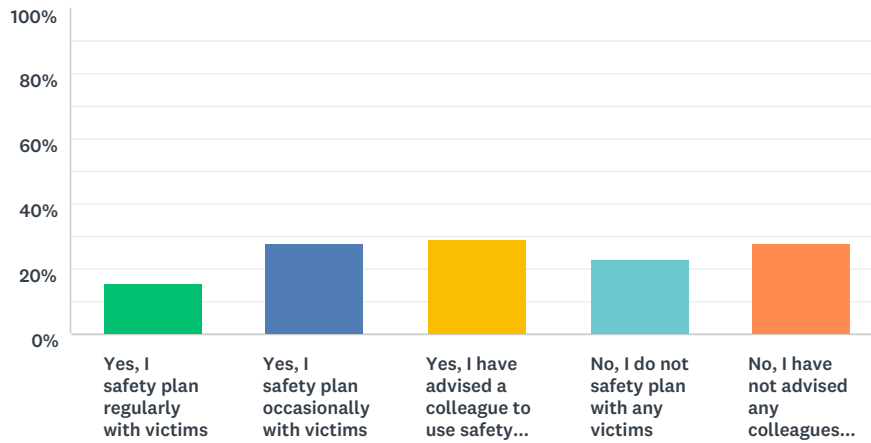

Q12 Have you carried out or advised a colleague to carry out any safety planning with a victim?

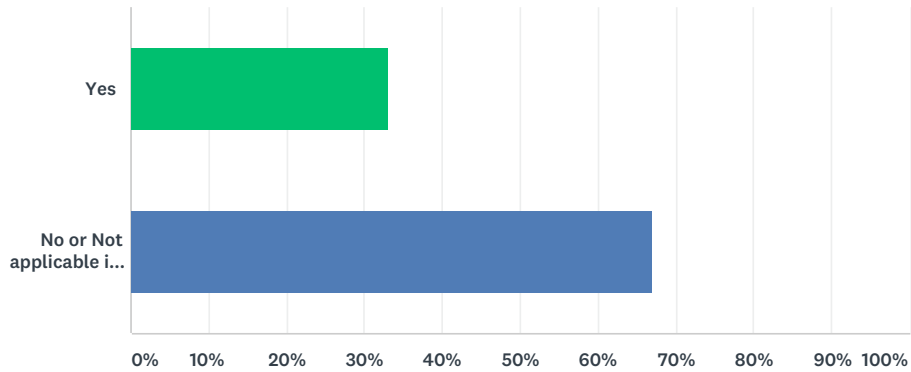

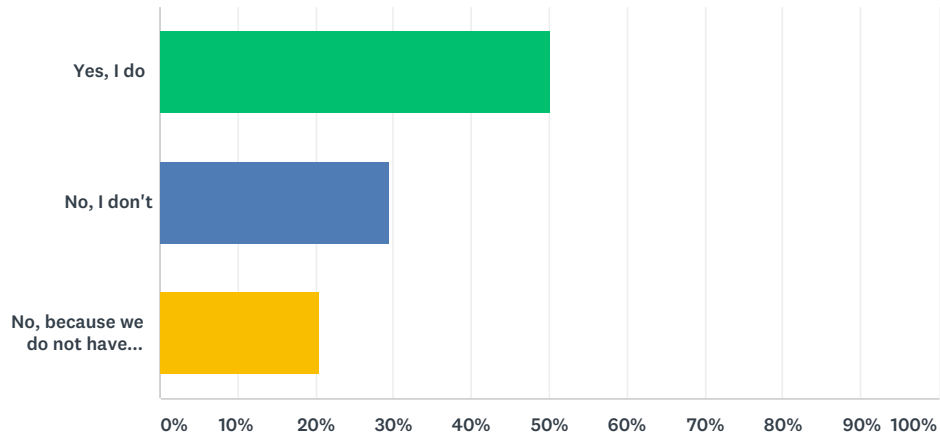

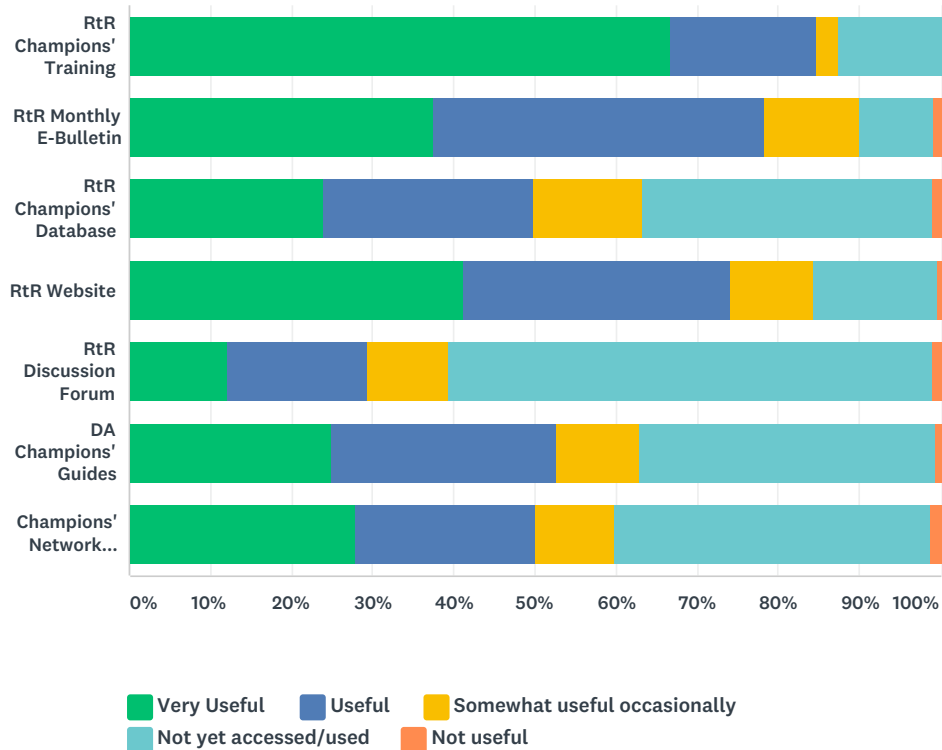

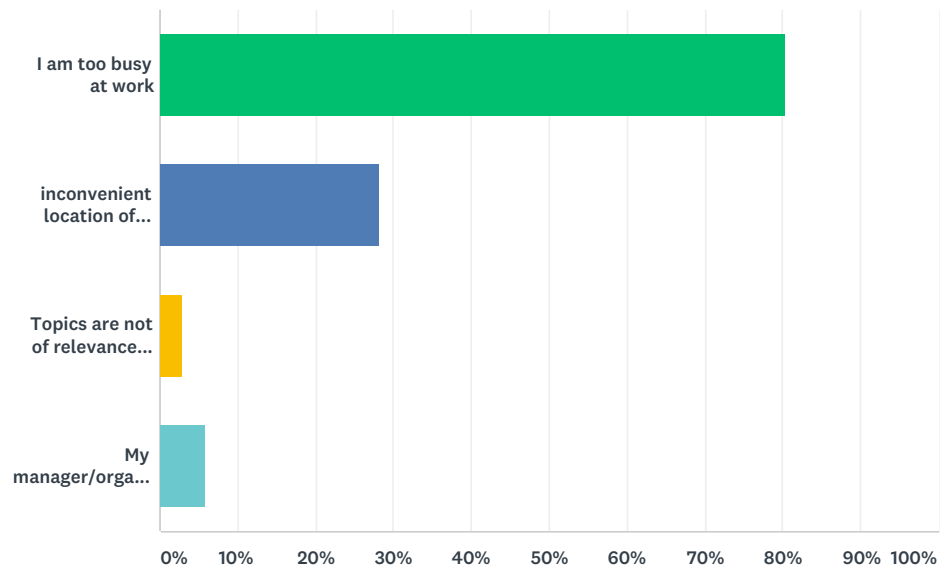

The phone is very rarely answered, email referrals are not responded to, clients are left with very little help are often just referred to Rights of Women. One client was not contacted by ODAS for almost 2 months following a referral.
